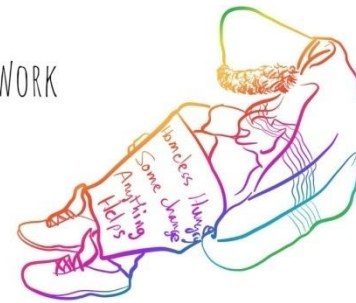

- EASILY OVERWHELMED

LINKED TO (OFTEN UNDIAGNOSED):

- AUTISM
- DYSLEXIA
- FOETAL ALCOHOL SPECTRUM DISORDER
- BRAIN INJURY

SEX WORKERS

ONE THIRD HAD BEEN LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN[IV]

39% HAVE HAD NO TRAINING OR FORMAL QUALIFICATIONS[I]

A THIRD HAD LEFT SCHOOL BEFORE 14; THOSE IN CARE HAD LEFT EARLIER[II]

SOCIAL EXCLUSION IS THE LEADING CAUSE OF ENTRANCE INTO SEX WORK[III]

YOUNG OFFENDERS

15% HAVE AN AUTISM DIAGNOSIS[II]

60 - 90% HAVE COMMUNICATION DIFFICULTIES[II]

25 - 50% ARE LIKELY TO HAVE DYSLEXIC DIFFICULTIES[III]

52% OF PRISON POPULATION HAVE LITERACY DIFFICULTIES[IV]

LEAVING PRISON CAN EXACERBATE SOCIAL EXCLUSION AND BE A RISK FACTOR LEADING TO SEX WORK[IV]

CARE LEAVERS

(ADULTS WHO WERE FORMERLY IN FOSTER CARE)

32% ARE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING[I]

53% HAVE A LEARNING DISABILITY[II]

43% HAVE AUTISM[III]

13% OF YOUNG CARE LEAVERS ARE IN CUSTODY[IV]

HOMELESS

52% OF YOUNG PEOPLE SHOWED SYMPTOMS OF SPECIFIC LEARNING DIFFICULTIES[I]

12% - 64% ARE AUTISTIC[II]

41% HAVE SERVED A PRISON SENTENCE[IV]

ON STREET SEX WORKERS HAVE HIGH RATES OF HOMELESSNESS[V]
